AIMS

Before Trip: Why is the Connecticut River Valley called one of the “last great places?”

After Trip: How does modern society affect the Connecticut River?

DO NOWS

Before Trip: Describe any river valley.

After Trip: Describe your experience on yesterday’s fieldtrip.

MOTIVATIONS

Before Trip: The Connecticut River is a National Heritage River and has been listed by The Nature Conservancy as "One of the Last Great Places." You will be traveling on it tomorrow! Why is it such a spectacular area?

After Trip: Why is the Connecticut River still so beautiful? Why aren't its shores surrounded by industries or large apartment buildings?

ACTIVITIES

Before Trip:

1. Introduce students to the features of a river valley.
2. Describe the ecosystem of the Connecticut River Valley.

After Trip:

1. Discuss the impact of technology on society, both positive and negative, focusing on the Connecticut River. Students will be able to use their field-trip experiences to accurately describe the interaction between humans and nature.

QUESTIONS

Before Trip:

1. What type of water is found in the Connecticut River Valley?
2. What type of plants and wildlife are found in the Connecticut River Valley?

After Trip:

1. How does modern technology often affect the environment?
2. How did people react to protect this area of Connecticut?

SUMMARY

Before Trip: The Connecticut River is a remarkably unchanged river valley that is home to diverse plant and wildlife.

After Trip: There were many pros and some cons associated with modern technology. Pollution in rivers is common.
